


Focus on: Judith Misalaba

- **1 United Kingdom:** Sue, Linda, Andy and Angela will arrive in Tanzania today. Sue and Linda will go on to Mwanza and Andy and Angela will go to Iringa. Please pray for safe travels and a fruitful visit.
 - **Tanzania:** From today, for the whole month, the EI Mwanza staff will be coordinating the first holistic mission course for the resident pastors at the church planting school. Pray for Peter, Elisha and Justina as they organise the curriculum, including inviting local experts and planning field visits.
- Canada and United Kingdom: The 2022 Christmas catalogue is now available. Pray for a good response, that God will open hearts to share. Tanzania: Sue and Linda are visiting the Beekeeping project in Kayenze and the Strength & Dignity project in Sangabuye today. Please pray for Justina and Laura as they host them and share about how the Lord is working through these projects.
- **3** South Africa: Danielle is past the halfway mark with her EMT practical work in Guadalajara, Mexico. She has had some very challenging calls on the ambulance but has enjoyed the challenge and the professionalism at the Red Cross Hospital. Please continue to pray for her.
- 4 South Africa: Don, Rachel and the boys appreciate prayers as they settle back into South Africa after the 6 week furlough in Canada. It was a busy time with 8500kms driven and conferences attended. It was a great time to reconnect with family and friends again... but too short.
- **5** Canada: Today El Canada is holding their Gala once again. We look forward to those who can attend and for a great evening of learning and seeing everyone.
 - **South Africa:** The Living Hope Bible church is camping in the second week of November. This will be the largest camp we've ever run thanks to the increase the Lord has brought to our church.
- **6** United Kingdom: Joel will be driving from Mwanza to Iringa, with Sue and Linda. This is a very long drive and, though we are breaking the trip with an overnight stay, it will be a taxing drive. Please keep Joel as the driver in your prayers.
 - **Phlippines:** Our Club 10:14 members plan to do more teacher's training this month.
- **7 Uganda:** A team of 8 church leaders, who completed the Kairos missions training earlier this year, are going to Kaabong to have a one week crosscultural exposure visit. The goal is to give them first-hand experience of the mission field, and to help them see where their churches can partner to address the gospel needs and opportunities.

- **8 Tanzania:** The El Tanzania board meeting is today. Pray for all those travelling to Iringa (Joel, Sue, Linda, Edward, Joshua and some of the board members); also for good discussions and good internet connection as other members will be meeting in Mwanza via zoom.
 - **Phlippines:** Pray for all the Matigsalug children who received school supplies in October; that the interest of the teachers to use our children's materials for their values education will be sustained.
- **9 Tanzania:** Pray for Joel, Sue, Linda, Angela and Andy today as they journey to participate in the handover ceremony of the water project in Ibumu village. In Mwanza, another set of 60 girls graduate from the Strength & Dignity Project today. They received 6 hours of menstrual health education and biblical teaching, as well as practical knowledge on how to make their own reusable pads.
- 10 Brazil: El Brazil is holding a prayer campaign to seek God's lead on how to respond to the growing hunger in Brazil, especially in the larger cities.
 Phlippines: "Children in conflict with the law" (CICL) are using Explorers Club materials through our partnership with the police department. Pray that they would realize their need for Jesus!
- **11 Malawi:** There has been a fuel crisis for more than two months now in the country. May we pray so that this fuel problem comes to an end.
- **12** International: The Strategic Plan process is in its early stages. Pray for those responding to questions being asked to help guide our organization. Pray for unity throughout this process.
- **13** Canada: Pam McGowan and Amy Maglayo in the finance office are preparing for this year's audit.
- 14 United Kingdom: Sue and Linda are returning to the UK today. Please pray for safe travel. There is a long layover in Dar es Salaam.
 Phlippines: One of our team members started a new prison ministry. Praise God for open doors in sharing the gospel.
- **15 Tanzania:** Mwanza office will be hosting 2 guests, Brian Chu and Lee James, who will be spending some time ministering to the team and visiting projects; also they will be teaching some sessions at the church planting school from today till the 17th.
- **16** International: The International Board meeting is scheduled for today. Please pray for God's continued wisdom for our Board as they guide Emmanuel International.
- 17 Brazil: Praise God for the good results of Águas Formosas PROPAC cooperative for the mothers of children and teenagers who attend the Day Care Center.

- **18 Uganda:** We hope to restart showing the Jesus Film in rural communities in 2023. In order to prepare for this we will be holding a three day training for church leaders in the 4th week of November.
- **19 Tanzania:** In Tanga we now have three villages for the TURAZIKUJA Project. Please pray for these groups to continue well and to be a good reference for other villages where we plan to start another TURAZIKUJA Project.
- **20** Malawi: There is a shortage of maize which is the staple food in the country. Let's pray for people in rural communities that God should make provision for them as it is expensive for them to buy because the price per 50kg bag is now at twenty five thousand kwacha (MK25000).
- **21 United Kingdom:** We are publishing another photo report this year. Please pray that the document will come together well and be a useful tool for promoting the work of EI.
- **22 Phlippines:** Nueva Ecija was badly hit by the last typhoon. Pray that the water refilling station which opened at the end of last month will help provide the community with drinking water at a very low price.
- **23 Haiti:** Our partner church in Haiti is the Oeuvre Evangelique Baptiste Bethesda. Please pray for the church as it serves its people in a difficult political and safety environment.
- **24 Uganda:** The Pads ministry is introducing a new, expanded curriculum, as we hope to spend more time engaging with the girls. This will allow us to go deeper with the girls, covering topics about menstruation and relationships from a Biblical perspective.
- **25 Phlippines:** Jada is a Manobo orphan who we helped get a major surgery done. Pray for complete recovery.
- **26** United States of America: Sherry's Mom is still in the hospital. She'll have one good day and then a bad day. Praying she improves to the point she can return to the Veteran's Home where they can still provide the care she needs but out of the hospital environment. Grateful for your prayers!
- **27 Malawi:** We pray for good rains as we are approaching the growing season.
- **28** Phlippines: In Palawan we are helping fishermen. Please pray that these fishermen catch enough for their families. More fishing boats are needed for other members too. Please pray that members will continue to worship Him even with their difficult situation.
- **29 Haiti:** Daniel Jovin is leading the work in Haiti from Canada, while fulfilling a demanding role as Headmaster of a school. Please pray for him as he balances the workload. Also pray for Phanell who is leading the work in Haiti.
- **30** International: Work continues on the Policy Manual that will soon be going to El Country offices for review. We are so thankful for God's wisdom and guidance through the long process of reviewing and rewriting this document.
