

Success stories: Saadani Health for Development



The Saadani Health for Development group was started in 2023 and now has 51 members. Their VICOBA activities were completed at the end of 2024. Members pay a TSh1,000 contribution each week for the group community fund, and also a Tsh500 contribution to the members challenges fund. In addition, they can buy up to tsh20,000 in shares each week if they wish. The community fund

is used to support the whole community in some way each year. In 2023 the group made a contribution to the village primary school towards school meals. Later the village leadership gave the group 2 acres of land in which to plant maize. One thing leads to another!

During the year, the group received poultry keeping and beekeeping seminars and people have implemented these practices.

Jairos Nganda's wife was a group member, keeping chickens. Sadly she died but Jairos has joined the group as it has been such a help to his wife. He has 80 chickens now and sells eggs and chicks each week. The poultry keeping training has helped Jairos and his wife develop their poultry business.

Eliza is also keeping chickens. She joined the group in 2024. She took a loan of Tsh100,000 to buy 20 chickens. She has 50 hens and will soon start to sell them.

The group chairwoman, Thelista Kinyaga, said that group members come from all over the village, not just from the Pentecostal Holiness Mission Church which hosts the group. Indeed, only 8 members are from the PHM church. The group has worked so well that there is a waiting list of villagers who want to join the group (there is a nominal limit of 50 members for a VICOBA group), so next year the membership will increase and there will be 2 VICOBA groups.

- **13 Philippines:** We have put in an application for a water project in Bacolod. Please pray for approval and funds.

Tanzania: We are writing proposals for project funding. Please pray for this and as we wait to hear back from funders.

- 14 Brazil: El Brazil has the goal to visit more churches in the more affluent cities to increase the number of partners. We need wisdom to make the right contacts. Malawi: There are twenty children at the Reading Club at Chisomo. They range in ability and learning challenges, but all are eager to improve their academics. It is a privilege to impact young lives and show them the love of Christ by supporting them this way.
- **15 Uganda:** In January we followed up with all of the GROW ministry sites, to make sure they did the local training to prepare for the showing of the Jesus Film. This month we hope to show the film in 6 different communities.
- 16 South Africa: Our church ministry at Living Hope Church would appreciate prayer. We have a very full calendar this year of conferences, outreaches, missions trips and leadership development. The other good news/bad news is that we are almost reaching capacity with our new venue. It wasn't intended to be a long-term move but we did not expect growth to be this steady.
